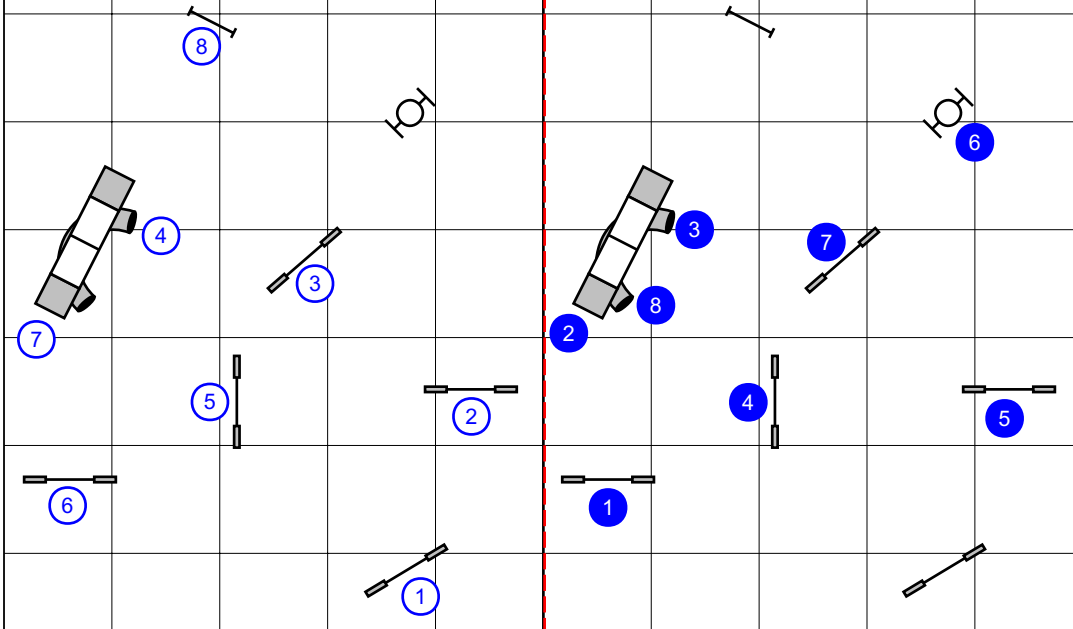
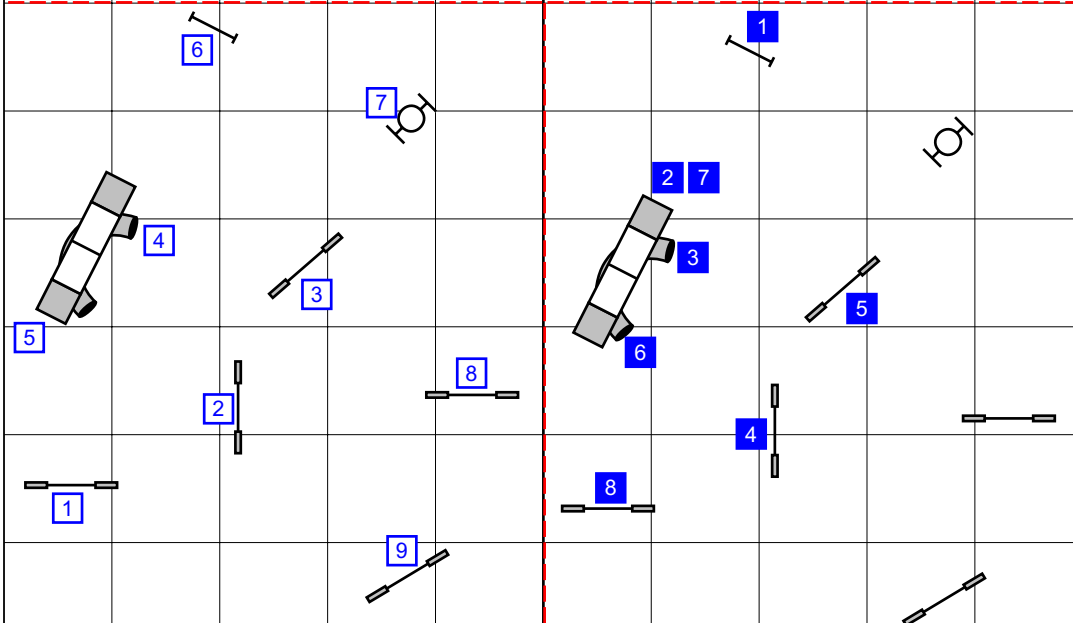


ARFF 4-20-22: Tunnel under A-frame



Just to get you started on this type of A-frame–tunnel discrimination, be careful of your approach to the A-frame at #7. What does your dog see as he flies over jump #6?

What will you do to make sure your dog takes the #2 A-frame instead of the tunnel? Wrap him into the #3 tunnel and threadle him into the #8 tunnel.



Here you have your dog going from the tunnel to the A-frame. If you rear-cross your dog using a hand cue that flips him away from you, you can flip him onto the A-frame. Otherwise, you'll have to beat him to the tunnel exit and front cross. You've probably seen people cue their dogs to do this on the contacts. It's a good thing to practice.

Here you send your dog from the A-frame to the further end of the tunnel and then have a flip from the tunnel into the A-frame. Stay on your toes for this one.
